## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) – – updated 2/3/23

### KIDS CAMP

**What happens if my child gets sick while at Kids camp or needs medication or medical attention?** We will have trained medical personnel with us at Kids Camp. If your child gets sick while at camp, you will receive communication from a CCV Staff member with instructions for picking up your child early. All prescription, over-the-counter medications along with inhalers or allergy pens need to be checked in at drop-off each day of camp and picked up the same day. Please do not pack medication with your child. You will receive specific instructions about medications once you register your child for camp.

**What if my child has a food allergy?** At Kids Camp, we will provide dinner and snacks which will consist of balanced, child-friendly options. To ensure our CCV culinary staff are prepared to meet your child's food needs, include any food allergies on your child's camp registration form.

**What if my student gets sick while at JH Camp or needs medication or medical attention?** We will have trained medical personnel with us at camp. If your student gets sick while at camp, you will receive communication from a CCV Staff member with instructions for picking up your student early. All prescription, over-the-counter medications along with inhalers or allergy pens need to be checked in at drop off the first day of camp. Please do not pack medication with your student. You will receive specific instructions about medications once you register your student for camp.

**What if my student has a food allergy?** At JH Camp, the UCYC culinary staff are prepared to accommodate only those who have a gluten allergy. Be sure to include a gluten allergy on your student's camp registration form.
